Preface

The futility of man's 'l'-ness or ego can be realised from Sant Jnyaneshwar's quote in Marathi that means - 'He who says I have attained it, knows nothing'. Ego is a major obstacle in the path of man's worldly and spiritual happiness. Since the seed of ego is present only in human birth, it is definitely present in everyone, irrespective of being young or old, rich or poor, educated or uneducated, etc. in varying proportions.

Ego is similar to weeds in a field. Until the weeds are destroyed completely, we cannot harvest a good crop. The weeds have also to be uprooted regularly. Similarly, until there is a complete elimination of one's ego, one cannot obtain God's grace completely. The very purpose of performing spiritual practice is elimination of ego; yet, it is so deeprooted in mankind that its elimination is not easy even while performing spiritual practice. Hence, instead of thinking that ego will be eliminated automatically by performing spiritual practice, we should make conscious efforts to remove ego.

Along with theoretical information on the definition of ego, its types, origin of ego, its removal, etc., this spiritual text provides information on the reasons for development of ego, the harm caused due to ego, the importance of ego removal, etc. This Spiritual text also enlists various aspects of spiritual practice required for reducing ego and the easy methods that can be adopted according to various Paths of spiritual practice. Efforts made by some seekers for ego removal, & their spiritual experiences are also included in this Text.

At several places in this spiritual text, in incidents or

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spiritual experiences quoted by other seekers, reference has been made to Parātpar Guru (Dr) Jayant Athavale, who is one of the Compilers of this spiritual text.
