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Preface

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Wearing a nine-yard saree, applying kumkum (Red powder made from turmeric) to the forehead and wearing a full set of ornaments - this is the traditional identity of a Hindu woman. Ornaments are an invaluable legacy of the Hindu culture. They have been preserved with pride for generations. With time, however, Hindu culture was influenced by the western culture. As a result, the cultural legacy in the form of ornaments began to be ignored. Nowadays, in the name of fashion, women do not wear bangles, stick a *bindi* instead of applying *kumkum* to the forehead. Some consider it a sign of backwardness to wear ornaments such as broad bangles, nose ring, toe rings. At the same time, many have a mistaken materialistic notion that ornaments are a medium to show off their wealth. The objective of this Text series is to impress upon the mind the spiritual perspective that an ornament is an object that facilitates the process of obtaining Divine grace.

Wearing ornaments enables us to obtain Shakti (Divine Energy) and *Chaitanya* (Divine consciousness), reduces the negative energy in the body, protects from negative energy attacks, and the part of the body where the ornament is worn is subjected to spiritual healing as in the case of Acupressure. These Texts elaborate such aspects along with the related science, thus revealing the importance of ornaments. It also includes scientific information on the comparison of ornaments made from different metals, ornaments for women, men and children, purification of

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35 the ornaments, etc. To understand the subtle process (taking place after wearing ornaments) is beyond the comprehension of an average individual. Subtle analysis and the subtle pictures made by Sanatan's seekers, who have subtle perception ability are the special features

have subtle perception ability, are the special features of these Texts. Subtle experiments conducted by the seekers on a gold chain, a gold ring, *sāttvik* (Spiritually pure) and *āsurī* (Demoniacal) ornaments, teach us to look at ornaments from the spiritual perspective.

It is not necessary to wear all the listed ornaments to obtain spiritual benefits. Depending on the individual's financial status, it is perfectly all right even if minimal ornaments are worn as advised by the Scriptures; for, more than the 'which' and 'how many' ornaments, it is the *bhāv* (Spiritual emotion) with which the ornaments are worn that matters. Those who cannot afford ornaments made of gold can wear gold-plated or silver ornaments, or at least one such ornament. When compared with the means for Godrealisation such as chanting, *satsēvā*, the benefits obtained from wearing ornaments are very less. Yet, for those who are not performing any spiritual practice or for seekers in the preliminary stages, ornaments are a boon from the perspective of increasing *sāttvikatā* (Spiritual purity).

We pray unto the Holy feet of Shrī Guru that upon reading these Texts, may everyone develop a spiritual perspective of looking at the ornaments and realise the greatness of Hindu Dharma which has gifted this invaluable treasure. - **Compiler**
